Important Notice (worth repeating): If you want to file a motion, pleading, waiver of hearing, or other document not listed above, you must mail it to the Springfield office. If the matter has been assigned to an administrative law judge (ALJ) or hearing officer, also send a courtesy copy of the filing to the ALJ or hearing officer, with proper notice to all parties. ¹ The Notes on Appeal form includes a section for proposing a stipulation. The Notes on Appeal form must be filed on an appeal to avoid the County being defaulted.

² For Cook County appeals where a hearing is requested by any party, a proposed stipulation can only be e-filed after a hearing or pre-hearing is scheduled. If a hearing has not been scheduled, the proposed stipulation must be mailed to the Springfield office.
