



**FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are Highland Park CVS, LLC, the appellant(s), by attorney Michael G. Flanagan, of Flanagan/Bilton LLC in Chicago; the Cook County Board of Review by Cook County Assistant State's Attorney Cristin Duffy; and Evanston-Skokie C.C.S.D #65, the intervenor, by attorney Ares G. Dalianis of Franczek Radelet P.C. in Chicago.

Prior to the hearing the parties reached an agreement as to the correct assessment of the subject property. This assessment agreement was presented to and considered by the Property Tax Appeal Board.

After reviewing the record and considering the evidence submitted, the Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this **Cook** County appeal. The Property Tax Appeal Board further finds that the agreement of the parties is proper, and the correct assessed valuation of the property is:

In order to comply with the above provision, YOU MUST FILE A PETITION AND EVIDENCE WITH THE PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED DECISION IN ORDER TO APPEAL THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR.

Based upon the issuance of a lowered assessment by the Property Tax Appeal Board, the refund of paid property taxes is the responsibility of your County Treasurer. Please contact that office with any questions you may have regarding the refund of paid property taxes.
