

# FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION ILLINOIS PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD

APPELLANT: Joseph C. Verdone Jr. DOCKET NO.: 13-28409.001-R-1 PARCEL NO.: 12-31-404-020-0000

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are Joseph C. Verdone Jr., the appellant(s); and the Cook County Board of Review.

Based on the facts and exhibits presented in this matter, the Property Tax Appeal Board hereby finds *No Change* in the assessment of the property as established by the **Cook** County Board of Review is warranted. The correct assessed valuation of the property is:

**LAND:** \$ 2,200 **IMPR.:** \$13,530 **TOTAL:** \$15,730

Subject only to the State multiplier as applicable.

## **Statement of Jurisdiction**

The appellant timely filed the appeal from a decision of the Cook County Board of Review pursuant to section 16-160 of the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/16-160) challenging the assessment for the 2013 tax year. The Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of the appeal.

#### **Findings of Fact**

The subject property consists of a one-story dwelling of masonry construction with 1,125 square feet of living area. The dwelling is 57 years old. Features of the home include a full unfinished basement. The property has a 8,000 square foot site and is located in Leyden Township, Cook County. The subject is classified as a class 2-03 property under the Cook County Real Property Assessment Classification Ordinance.

The appellant contends overvaluation as the basis of the appeal. In support of this argument the appellant submitted sale and adjustment information on six comparable sales.

The board of review submitted its "Board of Review Notes on Appeal" disclosing the total assessment for the subject of \$15,730. The subject property reflects a market value of \$157,300 or \$139.82 per square foot of living area, when applying the level of assessment for class 2 properties of 10.00% as determined by the Cook County classification ordinance.

In support of its contention of the correct assessment, the board of review submitted information on four equity comparables with sale information for each comparable.

In rebuttal, the appellant requested that the Board disregard the board of review's suggested comparable sales.

## **Conclusion of Law**

The appellant contends the market value of the subject property is not accurately reflected in its assessed valuation. When market value is the basis of the appeal the value of the property must be proved by a preponderance of the evidence. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.63(e). Proof of market value may consist of an appraisal of the subject property, a recent sale, comparable sales or construction costs. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.65(c). The Board finds the appellant has not met this burden of proof and a reduction in the subject's assessment is not warranted.

The Board finds the best evidence of market value to be the appellant's sales comparables #1, #4, #5, and #6. These sales occurred from January 2013 to September 2013 and sold from \$58.31 to \$141.76 per square foot of living area. There was no consideration of adjustments in the property equalization chart. The current assessed valuation is at \$139.82 per square foot of living area which is within the range established by these comparables. Based on this record the Board finds the appellant did not demonstrate with preponderance of the evidence that the subject's improvement is not accurately reflected in its assessed valuation.

the session of the Board of Review at which assessments for the subsequent year are being considered, the taxpayer may, within 30 days after the date of written notice of the Property Tax Appeal Board's decision, appeal the assessment for the subsequent year directly to the Property Tax Appeal Board."
