



**FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION
ILLINOIS PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD**

APPELLANT: National Home Rentals

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are National Home Rentals, the appellant, by attorney Peter D. Verros, of Verros Berkshire, PC in Chicago; and the Cook County Board of Review.

Based on the facts and exhibits presented in this matter, the Property Tax Appeal Board hereby finds No Change in the assessment of the property as established by the Cook County Board of Review is warranted. The correct assessed valuation of the property is:

LAND: \$2,437
IMPR.: \$5,320
TOTAL: \$7,757

Subject only to the State multiplier as applicable.

Statement of Jurisdiction

The appellant timely filed the appeal from a decision of the Cook County Board of Review pursuant to section 16-160 of the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/16-160) challenging the assessment for the 2017 tax year. The Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of the appeal.

Findings of Fact

The subject property consists of a 1.5-story dwelling of masonry exterior construction with 760 square feet of living area. The dwelling is approximately 69 years old. Features of the home include a full unfinished basement, and a one-car garage. The property has a 7,500 square foot site and is located in Richton Park, Rich Township, Cook County. The subject is classified as a Class 2-02 property under the Cook County Real Property Assessment Classification Ordinance.

The appellant contends assessment inequity as the basis of the appeal. The subject's land assessment was not contested. In support of this argument the appellant submitted information on four equity comparables located from 1.5 to 1.8-miles and in the same neighborhood code as the subject. The comparables are improved with class 2-02 dwellings of either frame or masonry exterior construction that range in age from 64 to 68 years old. Two comparables have a full unfinished basement and two comparables lack a basement. Two comparables have central air conditioning, and two comparables have a one-car garage. The dwellings range in size from 528 to 948 square feet of living area and have improvement assessments ranging from \$3,083 to

\$5,309 or from \$5.60 to \$5.94 per square foot of living area. Based on this evidence, the appellant requested that the improvement assessment be reduced to \$4,362 or \$5.74 per square foot of living area.

The board of review submitted its "Board of Review Notes on Appeal" disclosing the total assessment for the subject of \$7,757. The subject property has an improvement assessment of \$5,320 or \$7.00 per square foot of living area.

In support of its contention of the correct assessment the board of review submitted information on four equity comparables located on the same block and same neighborhood code as the subject. The comparables were improved with class 2-02 1-story or 1.5-story dwellings of masonry or frame and masonry exterior construction that range in size from 765 to 837 square feet of living area and range in age from 66 to 70 years old. Three comparables have a full unfinished basement with one comparable having finished area and one comparable lacks a basement. Each comparable has either a one-car or a two-car garage. The comparables have improvement assessments that range from \$6,035 to \$6,658 or from \$7.21 to \$8.70 per square foot of living area. Based on this evidence, the board of review requested that the assessment be confirmed.

Conclusion of Law

The taxpayer contends assessment inequity as the basis of the appeal. When unequal treatment in the assessment process is the basis of the appeal, the inequity of the assessments must be proved by clear and convincing evidence. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.63(e). Proof of unequal treatment in the assessment process should consist of documentation of the assessments for the assessment year in question of not less than three comparable properties showing the similarity, proximity and lack of distinguishing characteristics of the assessment comparables to the subject property. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.65(b). The Board finds the appellant did not meet this burden of proof and a reduction in the subject's assessment is not warranted.

The parties submitted eight suggested comparables for the Board's consideration. The Board gave less weight to the appellant's comparables due to these comparables being over 1.5-miles from the subject. The Board gave less weight to the board of review comparable #1 for lack of basement when compared to the subject. The Board gave less weight to the board of review comparable #2 as this comparable differs in design when compared to the subject.

The Board finds that the best evidence of assessment equity is the board of review's comparables #3 and #4. These comparables have varying degrees of similarity when compared to the subject in age, dwelling size, and features. These comparables have improvement assessments of \$6,517 to \$6,584 or \$8.52 and \$8.60 per square foot of living area. The subject property has an improvement assessment of \$5,320 or \$7.00 per square foot of living area, which falls below the best comparables contained in this record. Based on this record, the Board finds the appellant did not demonstrate with clear and convincing evidence that the subject's improvement was inequitably assessed and a reduction in the assessment is not justified.

This is a final administrative decision of the Property Tax Appeal Board which is subject to review in the Circuit Court or Appellate Court under the provisions of the Administrative Review Law (735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.) and section 16-195 of the Property Tax Code. Pursuant to Section 1910.50(d) of the rules of the Property Tax Appeal Board (86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.50(d)) the proceeding before the Property Tax Appeal Board is terminated when the decision is rendered. The Property Tax Appeal Board does not require any motion or request for reconsideration.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Section 16-185 of the Property Tax Code provides in part:

"If the Property Tax Appeal Board renders a decision lowering the assessment of a particular parcel after the deadline for filing complaints with the Board of Review or after adjournment of the session of the Board of Review at which assessments for the subsequent year or years of the same general assessment period, as provided in Sections 9-125 through 9-225, are being considered, the taxpayer may, within 30 days after the date of written notice of the Property Tax Appeal Board's decision, appeal the assessment for such subsequent year or years directly to the Property Tax Appeal Board."

In order to comply with the above provision, YOU MUST FILE A PETITION AND EVIDENCE WITH THE PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED DECISION IN ORDER TO APPEAL THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR OR YEARS. A separate petition and evidence must be filed for each of the remaining years of the general assessment period.

Based upon the issuance of a lowered assessment by the Property Tax Appeal Board, the refund of paid property taxes is the responsibility of your County Treasurer. Please contact that office with any questions you may have regarding the refund of paid property taxes.
