

FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION ILLINOIS PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are Bruce Burch, the appellant, by attorney Gregory Riggs, of Tax Appeals Lake County in Lake Zurich; and the Lake County Board of Review.

Based on the facts and exhibits presented in this matter, the Property Tax Appeal Board hereby finds *No Change* in the assessment of the property as established by the **Lake** County Board of Review is warranted. The correct assessed valuation of the property is:

LAND: \$19,701 **IMPR.:** \$60,351 **TOTAL:** \$80,052

Subject only to the State multiplier as applicable.

Statement of Jurisdiction

The appellant timely filed the appeal from a decision of the Lake County Board of Review pursuant to section 16-160 of the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/16-160) challenging the assessment for the 2019 tax year. The Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of the appeal.

Findings of Fact

The subject property consists of a one-story dwelling of wood siding exterior construction with 1,604 square feet of living area. The dwelling was constructed in 1976. Features of the home include an unfinished basement, central air conditioning, one fireplace and a 483 square foot garage. The property has an 11,200 square foot site and is located in Mundelein, Fremont Township, Lake County.

The appellant contends overvaluation as the basis of the appeal. In support of this argument the appellant submitted information on four comparable sales located within 0.27 of a mile from the subject property. The comparables have sites that range in size from 10,000 to 11,630 square feet of land area and are improved with one-story dwellings of wood siding exterior construction that range in size from 1,604 to 1,988 square feet of living area. The dwellings were built from 1970 to 1975. Three comparables have unfinished basements and one comparable has a crawl

space foundation. Each comparable has central air conditioning and a garage ranging in size from 440 to 520 square feet of building area. Three comparables each have one fireplace. The properties sold from May 2017 to November 2018 for prices ranging from \$201,000 to \$272,000 or from \$110.38 to \$141.76 per square foot of living area, land included. Based on this evidence, the appellant requested the subject's assessment be reduced to \$74,992 which reflects a market value of \$224,998 or \$140.27 per square foot of living area, land included, when applying the statutory assessment level of 33.33%.

The board of review submitted its "Board of Review Notes on Appeal" disclosing the total assessment for the subject of \$80,052. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$243,393 or \$151.74 per square foot of living area, land included, when using the 2019 three year average median level of assessment for Lake County of 32.89% as determined by the Illinois Department of Revenue.

In support of its contention of the correct assessment the board of review submitted information on four comparable sales located in the same assessment neighborhood code as the subject property. Board of review comparable #1 is the same property as the appellant's comparable #1. The comparables have sites that range in size from 11,630 to 13,020 square feet of land area and are improved with one-story dwellings of wood siding exterior construction that range in size from 1,604 to 1,827 square feet of living area. The homes were built from 1970 to 1975. Each comparable has a basement, two with finished area, central air conditioning, one fireplace and a garage ranging in size from 440 to 520 square feet of building area. The properties sold from December 2016 to March 2020 for prices ranging from \$259,000 to \$303,000 or from \$141.76 to \$166.39 per square foot of living area, land included. Based on this evidence, the board of review requested the subject's assessment be confirmed.

Conclusion of Law

The appellant contends the market value of the subject property is not accurately reflected in its assessed valuation. When market value is the basis of the appeal the value of the property must be proved by a preponderance of the evidence. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.63(e). Proof of market value may consist of an appraisal of the subject property, a recent sale, comparable sales or construction costs. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.65(c). The Board finds the appellant did not meet this burden of proof and a reduction in the subject's assessment is not warranted.

The records contain seven comparable sales for the Board's consideration as one comparable was common to both parties. The Board gave less weight to the appellant's comparables #3 and #4 along with board of review comparables #3 and #4 which sold less proximate in time to the January 1, 2019 assessment date, differ in foundation type/finish and/or differ in dwelling size when compared to the subject.

The Board finds the best evidence of market value to be the remaining comparables which includes the common comparable and are more similar to the subject in location, age, dwelling size and most features. These comparables sold from April to July 2018 for prices ranging from \$201,000 to \$289,900 or from \$110.38 to \$159.20 per square foot of living area, including land. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$243,393 or \$151.74 per square foot of living area, including land, which falls within the range established by the best comparable sales in this

record. After considering adjustments to the comparables for differences from the subject, the Board finds a reduction in the subject's assessment is not justified.

This is a final administrative decision of the Property Tax Appeal Board which is subject to review in the Circuit Court or Appellate Court under the provisions of the Administrative Review Law (735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.) and section 16-195 of the Property Tax Code. Pursuant to Section 1910.50(d) of the rules of the Property Tax Appeal Board (86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.50(d)) the proceeding before the Property Tax Appeal Board is terminated when the decision is rendered. The Property Tax Appeal Board does not require any motion or request for reconsideration.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Section 16-185 of the Property Tax Code provides in part:

"If the Property Tax Appeal Board renders a decision lowering the assessment of a particular parcel after the deadline for filing complaints with the Board of Review or after adjournment of the session of the Board of Review at which assessments for the subsequent year or years of the same general assessment period, as provided in Sections 9-125 through 9-225, are being considered, the taxpayer may, within 30 days after the date of written notice of the Property Tax Appeal Board's decision, appeal the assessment for such subsequent year or years directly to the Property Tax Appeal Board."

In order to comply with the above provision, YOU MUST FILE A <u>PETITION AND EVIDENCE</u> WITH THE PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED DECISION IN ORDER TO APPEAL THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR OR YEARS. A separate petition and evidence must be filed for each of the remaining years of the general assessment period.

Based upon the issuance of a lowered assessment by the Property Tax Appeal Board, the refund of paid property taxes is the responsibility of your County Treasurer. Please contact that office with any questions you may have regarding the refund of paid property taxes.
