



**FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION
ILLINOIS PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD**

APPELLANT: Samantha Goldberg

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are Samantha Goldberg, the appellant, by attorney David R. Bass, of Field and Goldberg, LLC in Chicago, and the Lake County Board of Review.

Based on the facts and exhibits presented in this matter, the Property Tax Appeal Board hereby finds **No Change** in the assessment of the property as established by the **Lake** County Board of Review is warranted. The correct assessed valuation of the property is:

LAND: \$23,488
IMPR.: \$51,538
TOTAL: \$75,026

Subject only to the State multiplier as applicable.

Statement of Jurisdiction

The appellant timely filed the appeal from a decision of the Lake County Board of Review pursuant to section 16-160 of the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/16-160) challenging the assessment for the 2019 tax year. The Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of the appeal.

Findings of Fact

The subject property consists of a one-story dwelling of wood siding exterior construction with 1,082 square feet of living area. The dwelling was constructed in 1985. Features of the home include a crawl space foundation, central air conditioning and a 220 square foot garage. The property has a 4,851 square foot site and is located in Buffalo Grove, Vernon Township, Lake County.

The appellant contends overvaluation as the basis of the appeal. In support of this argument the appellant submitted information on ten comparable sales located within .15 miles from the subject property. The comparables consist of one-story dwellings of frame exterior construction with each having 1,082 or 1,243 square feet of living area. The dwellings were built from 1983 to 1985. Each comparable has central air conditioning and a garage with 220 square feet of building area. Two comparables each have one fireplace. The comparables have sites ranging in

size from 4,851 to 7,247 square feet of land area. The comparables sold from March 2016 to July 2018 for prices ranging from \$199,000 to \$245,000 or from \$160.90 to \$203.33 per square foot of living area including land. Based on this evidence the appellant requested a reduction in the subject's assessment.

The board of review submitted its "Board of Review Notes on Appeal" disclosing the total assessment for the subject of \$75,026. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$228,112 or \$210.82 per square foot of living area, land included, when using the 2019 three-year average median level of assessment for Lake County of 32.89% as determined by the Illinois Department of Revenue.

In support of its contention of the correct assessment, the board of review submitted information on five comparable sales located within .21 miles from the subject property. The comparables are improved with one-story dwellings of wood siding exterior construction that have either 1,082 or 1,243 square feet of living area. The dwellings were constructed from 1983 to 1985. Each comparable has a crawl space foundation, central air conditioning and a garage with 220 square feet of building area. Two comparables each have one fireplace. The comparables have sites ranging in size from 4,850 to 5,270 square feet of land area. These properties sold from January to July 2019 for prices ranging from \$230,000 to \$262,000 or from \$197.10 to \$214.88 per square foot of living area, including land. Based on this evidence the board of review requested confirmation of the subject's assessment.

Conclusion of Law

The appellant contends the market value of the subject property is not accurately reflected in its assessed valuation. When market value is the basis of the appeal the value of the property must be proved by a preponderance of the evidence. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.63(e). Proof of market value may consist of an appraisal of the subject property, a recent sale, comparable sales or construction costs. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.65(c). The Board finds the appellant did not meet this burden of proof and a reduction in the subject's assessment is not warranted.

The parties submitted 15 comparable sales for the Board's consideration. The Board gives less weight to appellant's comparables #1 through #4, #6, #8 and #9 due to their dated sales in 2016 or 2017 which were less proximate in time to the January 1, 2019 assessment than the other sales in the record. The Board also gives less weight to appellant's comparables #3 and #5 through #9 along with board of review comparables #2, #3 and #5 which have a larger dwelling size when compared to the subject.

The Board finds the best evidence of market value to be appellant's comparable #10 along with board of review comparables #1 and #4 which sold proximate in time to the assessment date at issue and are identical or nearly identical to the subject in dwelling size and features. These comparables sold from April 2018 to April 2019 for prices ranging from \$220,000 to \$232,500 or from \$203.33 to \$214.88 per square foot of living area, including land. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$228,112 or \$210.82 per square foot of living area, including land, which falls within the range established by the best comparable sales in the record. Based on this evidence, the Board finds the appellant failed to prove by a preponderance of the evidence that a reduction in the subject's assessment is justified based on overvaluation.

This is a final administrative decision of the Property Tax Appeal Board which is subject to review in the Circuit Court or Appellate Court under the provisions of the Administrative Review Law (735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.) and section 16-195 of the Property Tax Code. Pursuant to Section 1910.50(d) of the rules of the Property Tax Appeal Board (86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.50(d)) the proceeding before the Property Tax Appeal Board is terminated when the decision is rendered. The Property Tax Appeal Board does not require any motion or request for reconsideration.

Section 16-185 of the Property Tax Code provides in part:

"If the Property Tax Appeal Board renders a decision lowering the assessment of a particular parcel after the deadline for filing complaints with the Board of Review or after adjournment of the session of the Board of Review at which assessments for the subsequent year or years of the same general assessment period, as provided in Sections 9-125 through 9-225, are being considered, the taxpayer may, within 30 days after the date of written notice of the Property Tax Appeal Board's decision, appeal the assessment for such subsequent year or years directly to the Property Tax Appeal Board."

In order to comply with the above provision, YOU MUST FILE A PETITION AND EVIDENCE WITH THE PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED DECISION IN ORDER TO APPEAL THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR OR YEARS. A separate petition and evidence must be filed for each of the remaining years of the general assessment period.

Based upon the issuance of a lowered assessment by the Property Tax Appeal Board, the refund of paid property taxes is the responsibility of your County Treasurer. Please contact that office with any questions you may have regarding the refund of paid property taxes.
