



**FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION  
ILLINOIS PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD**

APPELLANT: Yvonne Buckingham

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are Yvonne Buckingham, the appellant, by attorney Ronald Kingsley, of Lake County Real Estate Tax Appeal, LLC in Lake Forest; and the Lake County Board of Review.

Based on the facts and exhibits presented in this matter, the Property Tax Appeal Board hereby finds **a Reduction** in the assessment of the property as established by the **Lake** County Board of Review is warranted. The correct assessed valuation of the property is:

**LAND:** \$44,018  
**IMPR.:** \$138,472  
**TOTAL:** \$182,490

Subject only to the State multiplier as applicable.

**Statement of Jurisdiction**

The appellant timely filed the appeal from a decision of the Lake County Board of Review pursuant to section 16-160 of the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/16-160) challenging the assessment for the 2020 tax year. The Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of the appeal.

**Findings of Fact**

The subject property consists of a two-story dwelling of wood siding exterior construction with 4,086 square feet of living area. The dwelling was constructed in 1986. Features of the home include an unfinished basement, central air conditioning, four fireplaces, and a garage containing 800 square feet of building area. The property has an approximately 62,730 square foot site and is located in Lake Barrington, Cuba Township, Lake County.

The appellant contends overvaluation as the basis of the appeal. In support of this argument the appellant submitted two grid analyses with information on four comparable sales.<sup>1</sup> Comparable #1 is in the same neighborhood code as the subject property. The comparables were built from 1983 to 1988 and consist of two-story dwellings of wood siding exterior construction ranging in

size from 3,297 to 4,084 square feet of living area. Each dwelling has central air conditioning, two or three fireplaces, a basement with finished area, and a garage ranging in size from 736 to 984 square feet of building area. The parcels range in size from 39,908 to 45,644 square feet of land area. The comparables sold from June 2019 to March 2020 for prices ranging from \$433,000 to \$510,000 or from \$110.19 to \$138.49 per square foot of living area, including land. Based on this evidence, the appellant requested a reduced assessment of \$182,490.

The board of review submitted its "Board of Review Notes on Appeal" disclosing the total assessment for the subject of \$193,030. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$579,844 or \$141.91 per square foot of living area, land included, when using the 2020 three-year average median level of assessment for Lake County of 33.29% as determined by the Illinois Department of Revenue.

In support of its contention of the correct assessment the board of review submitted information on five comparable sales. Comparable #1 is the same as appellant's comparable #1. The comparables consist of two-story dwellings of brick, wood siding, or brick and wood siding exterior construction ranging in size from 3,758 to 4,154 square feet of living area. The dwellings were built from 1984 to 1998. Each dwelling has central air conditioning, one to three fireplaces, and a garage ranging in size from 689 to 1,000 square feet of building area. Each dwelling has a basement with three having finished area. The parcels range in size from 41,900 to 60,110 square feet of land area. The comparables sold from February 2019 to April 2020 for prices ranging from \$450,000 to \$780,000 or from \$109.97 to \$207.56 per square foot of living area, including land. Based on this evidence, the board of review requested confirmation of the subject's assessment.

### **Conclusion of Law**

The appellant contends the market value of the subject property is not accurately reflected in its assessed valuation. When market value is the basis of the appeal the value of the property must be proved by a preponderance of the evidence. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.63(e). Proof of market value may consist of an appraisal of the subject property, a recent sale, comparable sales or construction costs. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.65(c). The Board finds the appellant met this burden of proof and a reduction in the subject's assessment is warranted.

The parties submitted a total of eight comparable sales, one of which was common to the parties, to support their respective positions before the Property Tax Appeal Board. The Board finds that none of the comparables are truly similar to the subject due to differences in site size, age, dwelling size, and/or some features. Nevertheless, the Board has given reduced weight to board of review comparables #2 through #5 due to their location and/or newer ages.

The Board finds the best evidence of market value to be the appellant's comparable sales and board of review comparable #1, which was the common comparable. These most similar comparables sold for prices ranging from \$433,000 to \$515,000 or from \$109.97 to \$138.49 per square foot of living area, including land. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$579,844 or \$141.91 per square foot of living area, including land, which is above the range established by the best comparable sales in this record. Based on this evidence, and after

considering adjustments to the best comparables for differences, the Board finds a reduction in the subject's assessment is justified.

This is a final administrative decision of the Property Tax Appeal Board which is subject to review in the Circuit Court or Appellate Court under the provisions of the Administrative Review Law (735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.) and section 16-195 of the Property Tax Code. Pursuant to Section 1910.50(d) of the rules of the Property Tax Appeal Board (86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.50(d)) the proceeding before the Property Tax Appeal Board is terminated when the decision is rendered. The Property Tax Appeal Board does not require any motion or request for reconsideration.

**IMPORTANT NOTICE**

Section 16-185 of the Property Tax Code provides in part:

"If the Property Tax Appeal Board renders a decision lowering the assessment of a particular parcel after the deadline for filing complaints with the Board of Review or after adjournment of the session of the Board of Review at which assessments for the subsequent year or years of the same general assessment period, as provided in Sections 9-125 through 9-225, are being considered, the taxpayer may, within 30 days after the date of written notice of the Property Tax Appeal Board's decision, appeal the assessment for such subsequent year or years directly to the Property Tax Appeal Board."

In order to comply with the above provision, YOU MUST FILE A PETITION AND EVIDENCE WITH THE PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED DECISION IN ORDER TO APPEAL THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR OR YEARS. A separate petition and evidence must be filed for each of the remaining years of the general assessment period.

Based upon the issuance of a lowered assessment by the Property Tax Appeal Board, the refund of paid property taxes is the responsibility of your County Treasurer. Please contact that office with any questions you may have regarding the refund of paid property taxes.
