

FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION ILLINOIS PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are Peter Wojnicki, the appellant, by attorney Ronald Kingsley, of Lake County Real Estate Tax Appeal, LLC in Lake Forest; and the Lake County Board of Review.

Based on the facts and exhibits presented in this matter, the Property Tax Appeal Board hereby finds *no change* in the assessment of the property as established by the **Lake** County Board of Review is warranted. The correct assessed valuation of the property is:

LAND: \$4,081 **IMPR.:** \$102,042 **TOTAL:** \$106,123

Subject only to the State multiplier as applicable.

Statement of Jurisdiction

The appellant timely filed the appeal from a decision of the Lake County Board of Review pursuant to section 16-160 of the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/16-160) challenging the assessment for the 2020 tax year. The Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of the appeal.

Findings of Fact

The subject property consists of a 2-story condominium dwelling of wood frame construction with 1,879 square feet of living area. The dwelling was constructed in 1976. Features of the dwelling include a full lookout basement, that is partially finished, central air conditioning, a fireplace and an attached 437 square foot garage. The property has a 2,040 square foot site and is located in Lake Barrington, Cuba Township, Lake County.

The appellant contends overvaluation as the basis of the appeal. In support of this argument the appellant submitted information on five comparable sales that are located within the same neighborhood code as the subject. The comparables have sites ranging in size from 1,616 to 1,879 square feet of land area that are improved with 1.5-story or 2-story condominium dwellings containing from 1,616 to 1,879 square feet of living area. The dwellings were built from 1977 to 1989. The comparables have basements, each of which have finished area, and

four of which have either a lookout or walkout. The comparables have central air conditioning, two fireplaces and an attached garage ranging in size from 420 to 522 square feet of building area. The comparables sold from January 2019 to March 2020 for prices ranging from \$250,000 to \$300,000 or from \$133.05 to \$174.72 per square foot of living area, including land.

Based on this evidence the appellant requested a reduction in the subject's assessment.

The board of review submitted its "Board of Review Notes on Appeal" disclosing the total assessment for the subject of \$106,123. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$318,783 or \$169.66 per square foot of living area, land included, when using the 2020 three-year average median level of assessment for Lake County of 33.29% as determined by the Illinois Department of Revenue.

In support of its contention of the correct assessment the board of review submitted information on five comparable sales that are located within the same neighborhood code as the subject. The board of review's comparable #2 is the same property as the appellant's comparable #1. The comparables have sites ranging in size from 1,790 to 2,040 square feet of land area that are improved with 2-story condominium dwellings containing from 1,785 to 1,879 square feet of living area. The dwellings were built from 1976 to 1985. The comparables have full basements, each of which have finished area, and two of which have a walkout. The comparables have central air conditioning, two fireplaces and an attached garage ranging in size from 437 to 496 square feet of living area. The comparables sold from May 2019 to July 2020 for prices ranging from \$250,000 to \$452,000 or from \$133.05 to \$253.22 per square foot of living area, including land.

Based on this evidence the board of review requested confirmation of the subject's assessment.

Conclusion of Law

The appellant contends the market value of the subject property is not accurately reflected in its assessed valuation. When market value is the basis of the appeal the value of the property must be proved by a preponderance of the evidence. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.63(e). Proof of market value may consist of an appraisal of the subject property, a recent sale, comparable sales or construction costs. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.65(c). The Board finds the appellant did not meet this burden of proof and a reduction in the subject's assessment is not warranted.

The parties submitted a total of nine comparable sales for the Board's consideration, one of which was submitted by both parties. The Board gives less weight to the appellant's comparables #2, #3, #4 and #5, as well as the board of review's comparable #3, due to their newer dwellings when compared to the subject. In addition, the appellant's comparables #3 and #4 are dissimilar 1.5-story dwellings, which are also smaller in size, when compared to the subject. The Board finds the parties' remaining comparables, which includes the parties' common comparable, are similar to the subject in location, style, age, size and many features. The best comparables sold from May 2019 to July 2020 for prices ranging from \$250,000 to \$407,407 or from \$133.05 to \$224.22 per square foot of living area, including land. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$318,783 or \$169.66 per square foot of living area, including land, which falls within the range established by the best comparable sales in the

record. After considering adjustments to the best comparables for differences when compared to the subject, the Board finds the subject's estimated market value as reflected by its assessment is supported. Based on this evidence the Board finds a reduction in the subject's assessment is not justified.

This is a final administrative decision of the Property Tax Appeal Board which is subject to review in the Circuit Court or Appellate Court under the provisions of the Administrative Review Law (735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.) and section 16-195 of the Property Tax Code. Pursuant to Section 1910.50(d) of the rules of the Property Tax Appeal Board (86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.50(d)) the proceeding before the Property Tax Appeal Board is terminated when the decision is rendered. The Property Tax Appeal Board does not require any motion or request for reconsideration.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Section 16-185 of the Property Tax Code provides in part:

"If the Property Tax Appeal Board renders a decision lowering the assessment of a particular parcel after the deadline for filing complaints with the Board of Review or after adjournment of the session of the Board of Review at which assessments for the subsequent year or years of the same general assessment period, as provided in Sections 9-125 through 9-225, are being considered, the taxpayer may, within 30 days after the date of written notice of the Property Tax Appeal Board's decision, appeal the assessment for such subsequent year or years directly to the Property Tax Appeal Board."

In order to comply with the above provision, YOU MUST FILE A <u>PETITION AND EVIDENCE</u> WITH THE PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED DECISION IN ORDER TO APPEAL THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR OR YEARS. A separate petition and evidence must be filed for each of the remaining years of the general assessment period.

Based upon the issuance of a lowered assessment by the Property Tax Appeal Board, the refund of paid property taxes is the responsibility of your County Treasurer. Please contact that office with any questions you may have regarding the refund of paid property taxes.
