

FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION ILLINOIS PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD

APPELLANT: Margaret Lewis DOCKET NO.: 20-04067.001-R-1 PARCEL NO.: 15-23-301-057

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are Margaret Lewis, the appellant, by attorney Eric Feldman of Eric Feldman & Assoc. P.C. in Chicago, and the Lake County Board of Review.

Based on the facts and exhibits presented in this matter, the Property Tax Appeal Board hereby finds <u>no change</u> in the assessment of the property as established by the **Lake** County Board of Review is warranted. The correct assessed valuation of the property is:

LAND: \$34,490 **IMPR.:** \$139,050 **TOTAL:** \$173,540

Subject only to the State multiplier as applicable.

Statement of Jurisdiction

The appellant timely filed the appeal from a decision of the LakeCounty Board of Review pursuant to section 16-160 of the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/16-160) challenging the assessment for the 2020 tax year. The Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of the appeal.

Findings of Fact

The subject property consists of a one-story dwelling of brick exterior construction built in 1995 that contains 3,444 square feet of living area. Features of the home include a slab foundation, central air conditioning, one fireplace and an attached garage with 480 square feet of building area. The property has a 9,150 square foot site located in Lincolnshire, Vernon Township, Lake County.

The appellant contends overvaluation as the basis of the appeal. In support of this argument the appellant submitted information on three comparable sales improved with one-story or two-story dwellings of brick exterior construction that range in size from 3,026 to 3,468 square feet of living area. The homes were built from 1993 to 1996. Each property has a slab foundation, central air conditioning, one fireplace and an attached garage ranging in size from 400 to 480 square feet of building area. The comparables are located within .08 of one mile from the

subject property with sites that range in size from 5,230 to 16,550 square feet of land area. The sales occurred from February 2019 to July 2020 for prices ranging from \$366,000 to \$575,000 or from \$120.95 to \$165.80 per square foot of living area, including land. The appellant requested the subject's total assessment be reduced to \$162,319.

The board of review submitted its "Board of Review Notes on Appeal" disclosing the total assessment for the subject of \$173,540. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$521,298 or \$151.36 per square foot of living area, land included, when using the 2020 three-year average median level of assessment for Lake County of 33.29% as determined by the Illinois Department of Revenue.

In support of its contention of the correct assessment the board of review submitted information on five comparable sales with comparables #1 and #5 being the same properties as appellant's comparables #3 and #2, respectively. The comparables are improved with one-story dwellings of brick exterior construction that have either 3,393 or 3,468 square feet of living area. The homes were built in 1993 or 1995. Each property has a slab foundation, central air conditioning, one fireplace and an attached garage with either 400 or 480 square feet of building area. The comparables are located within .18 of one mile from the subject property with sites that range in size from 6,100 to 16,550 square feet of land area. The sales occurred from February 2019 to September 2020 for prices ranging from \$500,000 to \$575,000 or from \$147.36 to \$165.80 per square foot of living area, including land.

Conclusion of Law

The appellant contends the market value of the subject property is not accurately reflected in its assessed valuation. When market value is the basis of the appeal the value of the property must be proved by a preponderance of the evidence. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.63(e). Proof of market value may consist of an appraisal of the subject property, a recent sale, comparable sales or construction costs. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.65(c). The Board finds the appellant did not meet this burden of proof and a reduction in the subject's assessment is not warranted.

The Board finds the best evidence of market value to be appellant's comparable sales #2 and #3 as well as the comparables submitted by the board of review, which includes the two common sales submitted by the parties. These properties are similar to the subject in location and are improved with homes similar to the subject in style, size, age and features. These comparables sold for prices ranging from \$500,000 to \$575,000 or from \$147.36 to \$165.80 per square foot of living area, including land. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$521,298 or \$151.36 per square foot of living area, including land, which is within the range established by the best comparable sales in this record. Little weight is given to appellant's comparable sale #1 due to differences from the subject dwelling in style and size. Based on this evidence the Board finds the assessment of the subject property as established by the board of review is correct and a reduction in the subject's assessment is not justified.

This is a final administrative decision of the Property Tax Appeal Board which is subject to review in the Circuit Court or Appellate Court under the provisions of the Administrative Review Law (735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.) and section 16-195 of the Property Tax Code. Pursuant to Section 1910.50(d) of the rules of the Property Tax Appeal Board (86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.50(d)) the proceeding before the Property Tax Appeal Board is terminated when the decision is rendered. The Property Tax Appeal Board does not require any motion or request for reconsideration.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Section 16-185 of the Property Tax Code provides in part:

"If the Property Tax Appeal Board renders a decision lowering the assessment of a particular parcel after the deadline for filing complaints with the Board of Review or after adjournment of the session of the Board of Review at which assessments for the subsequent year or years of the same general assessment period, as provided in Sections 9-125 through 9-225, are being considered, the taxpayer may, within 30 days after the date of written notice of the Property Tax Appeal Board's decision, appeal the assessment for such subsequent year or years directly to the Property Tax Appeal Board."

In order to comply with the above provision, YOU MUST FILE A <u>PETITION AND EVIDENCE</u> WITH THE PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED DECISION IN ORDER TO APPEAL THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR OR YEARS. A separate petition and evidence must be filed for each of the remaining years of the general assessment period.

Based upon the issuance of a lowered assessment by the Property Tax Appeal Board, the refund of paid property taxes is the responsibility of your County Treasurer. Please contact that office with any questions you may have regarding the refund of paid property taxes.
