



**FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION  
ILLINOIS PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD**

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are Lisa Peck, the appellant, by attorney Eric Feldman, of Eric Feldman & Assoc. P.C. in Chicago; and the Lake County Board of Review.

Based on the facts and exhibits presented in this matter, the Property Tax Appeal Board hereby finds **No Change** in the assessment of the property as established by the **Lake** County Board of Review is warranted. The correct assessed valuation of the property is:

**LAND:** \$23,258  
**IMPR.:** \$66,019  
**TOTAL:** \$89,277

Subject only to the State multiplier as applicable.

**Statement of Jurisdiction**

The appellant timely filed the appeal from a decision of the Lake County Board of Review pursuant to section 16-160 of the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/16-160) challenging the assessment for the 2021 tax year. The Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of the appeal.

**Findings of Fact**

The subject property consists of a 1-story dwelling with 1,612 square feet of living area. The dwelling was constructed in 1992. Features of the home include a basement with finished area, central air conditioning and a fireplace. The property is located in Buffalo Grove, Vernon Township, Lake County.

The appellant contends overvaluation as the basis of the appeal. In support of this argument the appellant submitted information on five comparable sales located within 0.42 of a mile from the subject. The comparables are improved with 1-story homes with 1,612 square feet of living area. The dwellings were built from 1989 to 1991. Each home has a concrete slab foundation and central air conditioning. Four homes each have a fireplace. The comparables sold from April 2020 to February 2021 for prices ranging from \$200,000 to \$245,000 or from \$141.64 to

\$173.51 per square foot of living area, including land. Based on this evidence the appellant requested a reduction in the subject's assessment.

The board of review submitted its "Board of Review Notes on Appeal" disclosing the total assessment for the subject of \$89,277. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$268,502 or \$166.56 per square foot of living area, land included, when using the 2021 three year average median level of assessment for Lake County of 33.25% as determined by the Illinois Department of Revenue. In support of its contention of the correct assessment the board of review submitted information on four comparable sales located within 0.43 of a mile from the subject. The comparables are improved with 1-story homes with 1,612 square feet of living area. The dwellings were built from 1988 to 1991. Each home has a basement, one of which has finished area, and central air conditioning. Three homes each have a fireplace. The comparables sold from August 2020 to June 2021 for prices ranging from \$245,000 to \$310,000 or from \$151.99 to \$192.31 per square foot of living area, including land.

The board of review submitted a brief contending that the subject has a basement with finished area compared to the concrete slab foundations of the appellant's comparables and the subject has one additional half bathroom compared to the appellant's comparables. The board of review asserted its comparables each have a basement, but only comparable #1 has finished basement area and an additional half bathroom like the subject.

Based on this evidence the board of review requested an increase in the subject's assessment to \$91,657 which would reflect a market value of \$275,660 or \$171.00 per square foot of living area, including land, when using the 2021 three year average median level of assessment for Lake County of 33.25% as determined by the Illinois Department of Revenue.

### **Conclusion of Law**

The appellant contends the market value of the subject property is not accurately reflected in its assessed valuation. When market value is the basis of the appeal the value of the property must be proved by a preponderance of the evidence. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.63(e). Proof of market value may consist of an appraisal of the subject property, a recent sale, comparable sales or construction costs. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.65(c). The Board finds the appellant did not meet this burden of proof and a reduction in the subject's assessment is not warranted.

The record contains a total of nine comparable sales for the Board's consideration. The Board gives less weight to the appellant's comparables, due to substantial differences from the subject in foundation type. The Board finds the best evidence of market value to be the board of review's comparables are identical to the subject in dwelling size and are similar to the subject in age, location, and features. These comparables sold for prices ranging from \$245,000 to \$310,000 or from \$151.99 to \$192.31 per square foot of living area, including land. The subject's assessment reflects a market value of \$268,502 or \$166.56 per square foot of living area, including land, which is within the range established by the best comparable sales in this record. Based on this evidence and after considering appropriate adjustments to the best comparables for differences when compared to the subject, the Board finds a reduction in the subject's assessment is not justified.

This is a final administrative decision of the Property Tax Appeal Board which is subject to review in the Circuit Court or Appellate Court under the provisions of the Administrative Review Law (735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.) and section 16-195 of the Property Tax Code. Pursuant to Section 1910.50(d) of the rules of the Property Tax Appeal Board (86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.50(d)) the proceeding before the Property Tax Appeal Board is terminated when the decision is rendered. The Property Tax Appeal Board does not require any motion or request for reconsideration.

**IMPORTANT NOTICE**

Section 16-185 of the Property Tax Code provides in part:

"If the Property Tax Appeal Board renders a decision lowering the assessment of a particular parcel after the deadline for filing complaints with the Board of Review or after adjournment of the session of the Board of Review at which assessments for the subsequent year or years of the same general assessment period, as provided in Sections 9-125 through 9-225, are being considered, the taxpayer may, within 30 days after the date of written notice of the Property Tax Appeal Board's decision, appeal the assessment for such subsequent year or years directly to the Property Tax Appeal Board."

In order to comply with the above provision, YOU MUST FILE A PETITION AND EVIDENCE WITH THE PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED DECISION IN ORDER TO APPEAL THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR OR YEARS. A separate petition and evidence must be filed for each of the remaining years of the general assessment period.

Based upon the issuance of a lowered assessment by the Property Tax Appeal Board, the refund of paid property taxes is the responsibility of your County Treasurer. Please contact that office with any questions you may have regarding the refund of paid property taxes.
