

FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION ILLINOIS PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD

APPELLANT: Emanuel Carlos Nunes Pinto de Meireles

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are Emanuel Carlos Nunes Pinto de Meireles, the appellant, by attorney John J. Piegore, of Sanchez, Daniels & Hoffman LLP in Chicago; and the Cook County Board of Review.

Based on the facts and exhibits presented in this matter, the Property Tax Appeal Board hereby finds *No Change* in the assessment of the property as established by the **Cook** County Board of Review is warranted. The correct assessed valuation of the property is:

LAND: \$7,500 **IMPR.:** \$18,500 **TOTAL:** \$26,000

Subject only to the State multiplier as applicable.

Statement of Jurisdiction

The appellant timely filed the appeal from a decision of the Cook County Board of Review pursuant to section 16-160 of the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/16-160) challenging the assessment for the 2021 tax year. The Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of the appeal.

Findings of Fact

The subject property consists of a 1.5-story dwelling of masonry exterior construction with 1,390 square feet of living area. The dwelling is approximately 133 years old. The home features a full basement, 2 bathrooms and a 2-car garage. The property has a 3,000 square foot site and is located in Chicago, South Chicago Township, Cook County. The subject is classified as a class 2-03 property under the Cook County Real Property Assessment Classification Ordinance.

The appellant contends assessment inequity with respect to the improvement as the basis of the appeal. In support of this argument the appellant submitted information on four comparables that are located within the same assessment neighborhood code as the subject property. The comparables consist of class 2-03 dwellings of masonry exterior construction ranging in size from 1,056 to 1,770 square feet of living area. The dwellings are 128 or 133 years old. The comparables each have a full basement, but no data was provided by the appellant concerning

finished basement area. The dwellings have 1 or 1.5 bathrooms, and three comparables have either a 1.5-car or a 2-car garage. The comparables have improvement assessments that range from \$11,370 to \$18,939 or from \$10.70 to \$10.86 per square foot of living area. Based on this evidence, the appellant requested the subject's improvement assessment be reduced to \$14,970 or \$10.70 per square foot of living area.

The board of review submitted its "Board of Review Notes on Appeal" disclosing the total assessment for the subject of \$26,000. The subject property has an improvement assessment of \$18,500 or \$13.31 per square foot of living area. In support of its contention of the correct assessment the board of review submitted information on four comparables that are located within the same assessment neighborhood code and the same block or subarea as the subject property. The comparables consist of class 2-03 dwellings of masonry exterior construction ranging in size from 1,077 to 1,408 square feet of living area. The dwellings are 126 to 133 years old. The comparables each have a full basement, two of which have finished area. The dwellings have 1 or 2 bathrooms, two comparables have central air conditioning, and each comparable has a 2-car garage. The comparables have improvement assessments of \$18,500 and \$19,500 or from \$13.70 to \$18.11 per square foot of living area. Based on this evidence, the board of review requested confirmation of the subject's assessment.

Conclusion of Law

The taxpayer contends assessment inequity as the basis of the appeal. When unequal treatment in the assessment process is the basis of the appeal, the inequity of the assessments must be proved by clear and convincing evidence. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.63(e). Proof of unequal treatment in the assessment process should consist of documentation of the assessments for the assessment year in question of not less than three comparable properties showing the similarity, proximity and lack of distinguishing characteristics of the assessment comparables to the subject property. 86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.65(b). The Board finds the appellant did not meet this burden of proof and a reduction in the subject's assessment is not warranted.

The parties submitted eight comparable properties for the Board's consideration. The Board has given less weight to the appellant's comparables #1, #2, and #3 along with the board of review comparables #2 and #4 due to differences from the subject in dwelling size, central air conditioning, and/or lack of a garage amenity.

The Board finds the best evidence of assessment equity to be the board of review comparables #1 and #3 which are overall more similar to the subject in location, design, age, dwelling size and most features. These two comparables have improvement assessments of \$18,500 and \$19,500 or \$13.70 and \$13.85 per square foot of living area, respectively. The subject's improvement assessment of \$18,500 or \$13.31 per square foot of living area matches the comparable with the lowest overall improvement assessment and falls below these two best comparables on a per-square-foot basis. After considering adjustments to the two best comparables for differences from the subject, the Board finds the appellant did not demonstrate with clear and convincing evidence that the subject's improvement was inequitably assessed and a reduction in the subject's assessment is not justified.

This is a final administrative decision of the Property Tax Appeal Board which is subject to review in the Circuit Court or Appellate Court under the provisions of the Administrative Review Law (735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.) and section 16-195 of the Property Tax Code. Pursuant to Section 1910.50(d) of the rules of the Property Tax Appeal Board (86 Ill.Admin.Code §1910.50(d)) the proceeding before the Property Tax Appeal Board is terminated when the decision is rendered. The Property Tax Appeal Board does not require any motion or request for reconsideration.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Section 16-185 of the Property Tax Code provides in part:

"If the Property Tax Appeal Board renders a decision lowering the assessment of a particular parcel after the deadline for filing complaints with the Board of Review or after adjournment of the session of the Board of Review at which assessments for the subsequent year or years of the same general assessment period, as provided in Sections 9-125 through 9-225, are being considered, the taxpayer may, within 30 days after the date of written notice of the Property Tax Appeal Board's decision, appeal the assessment for such subsequent year or years directly to the Property Tax Appeal Board."

In order to comply with the above provision, YOU MUST FILE A <u>PETITION AND EVIDENCE</u> WITH THE PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED DECISION IN ORDER TO APPEAL THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR OR YEARS. A separate petition and evidence must be filed for each of the remaining years of the general assessment period.

Based upon the issuance of a lowered assessment by the Property Tax Appeal Board, the refund of paid property taxes is the responsibility of your County Treasurer. Please contact that office with any questions you may have regarding the refund of paid property taxes.
